# Chair Chat By Christie Freestone

"Human rights education should involve more than the provision of information and should constitute a comprehensive life-long process by which people at all levels in development and in all strata of society learn respect for the dignity of others and the means and methods of ensuring that respect in all societies." --UN General Assembly

Democrats believe that the economy should work for everyone, health care is a right, our diversity is our strength, and democracy is worth defending. When polled at the last school board meeting, five of the six members present were opposed to adding the phrase "hate speech or symbols, including, but not limited to, swastikas or Confederate flags," to the student expression section of the document. Only one school board member believed this phrase should be included in board policy. Additionally, some of our elected school board members felt there was no need to include a gender identity section at all.


In June of 2021, the U.S. Department of Education's Office for Civil Rights issued a Notice of Interpretation explaining that it will enforce Title IX's prohibition on discrimination on the basis of sex to include: (1) discrimination based on sexual orientation; and (2) discrimination based on gender identity. Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972 prohibits discrimination on the basis of sex in any education program or activity offered by a recipient of federal financial assistance.

The Department's interpretation stems from a landmark U.S. Supreme Court decision in which the Supreme Court recognized that it is impossible to discriminate against a person based on their sexual orientation or gender identity without discriminating against that person based on sex. The Supreme Court upheld the right for LGBTQ+ people to live and work without fear of harassment, exclusion, and discrimination. Consequently, LGBTQ+ students have the same rights and deserve the same treatment. Hence, all students—including LGBTQ+ students—deserve the opportunity to learn and thrive in schools that are free from discrimination.

I retired last year after serving as a Gratiot County teacher in private and public schools for over 40 years. Several times throughout my teaching career, I observed discrimination, bullying and harassment of students and their families of minority race, religion and diversity. Sadly, little has changed for diverse populations in our county in the past 40 years.

There is public comment time at the beginning of all Alma School Board meetings. If you would like to express your opinions before decisions are made which will impact our local students, please plan to attend the next school board meeting on Monday, August 14, 2023 at 6:00PM at the Alma Middle School multi-purpose room. If you cannot attend the meeting but would like to contact individual school board members, you can find contact information on the Alma Public Schools webpage.

The next few meetings of the Alma School Board are at 6:00PM: Aug. 14, Aug. 22, Sept. 11, Sept. 26, Oct 9 and Oct 24.

### The Next Chapter Book Club By Nancy O'Brien



# Michigan's Second Congressional District Democratic Party






